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A Personal Story

We recently received an e-mail from Rhonda who wished to share her personal story and the impact LBW made in her life.

“I had a rough childhood growing up and found myself in trouble with the law quite frequently. Ultimately, I ended up in a Northern California prison serving a 14-year sentence for some stupid decisions. Keep in mind I was never raised believing in God and I was incredibly angry at life in general when I entered prison.

After a few years, an opportunity developed where I could become certified as a Braille transcriber and do work at the prison for other companies. It was a really good job, easier than many others within the prison, but I had to keep myself clean and out of trouble. After spending a year to get certified, I began work at the prison. Almost immediately, I became the primary transcriber for many of Lutheran Braille Workers' materials.

I was constantly reading the devotionals, books, and other resources you sent to us during the transcription and proofreading process. At first, I wasn't paying much attention as I was simply trying to get through everything as quickly as possible. But I kept reading more and more, and the thing which stood out was the unconditional love of Jesus for people who were always in trouble.

Eventually I reached out to the chaplain at the prison with questions I needed answered. After a year or so of attending worship, I became baptized into the most amazing family ever. My life is dedicated to Jesus. Recently, I was released from prison, and I was able to get a job doing Braille transcription for textbooks. However, my life forever changed when I became a Christian, and this only happened because of your ministry. Thank you for everything you do in sharing the Good News with people around the world.

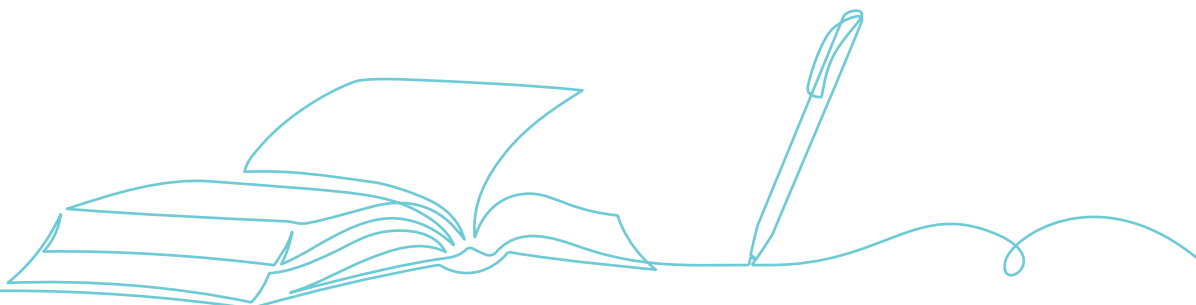

Walking the Way by Heart

Whenever I'm in an unfamiliar place, I like to ask someone to explain the layout, then walk through it with me a few times, pointing out hazards and helpful landmarks; pillars, tables, or anything stationary to give me hints about my exact location. At first, I feel for every reference point so I won't get lost or do any damage, but later, the route becomes second nature, and I hardly notice them. Once I know a place, people with sight realize it, and they don't worry about me as much. If I don't take the time to note every hazard and landmark in the beginning though, I'll lose my mental map, and sighted friends feel obligated to become sighted guides.

The Law God gave to Israel encompassed far more than worship within the contexts of Sabbaths or feasts. God was to be remembered and honored in every action (Deut. 6:4-9). It was only kept perfectly by Jesus (1 John 3:4-5), Who fulfilled it to cleanse His people from sin (Rom. 8:1-4). A guardian to the faithful until Christ's coming (Gal 3:24), the Law showed every danger and point of reference to a people who needed to be closely guided. God had promised His people that,

“I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, ‘Know the LORD,’ for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest.” (Jer. 31:33b-34a ESV). The Law would no longer be a series of statements carved in stone and taught by another person, but a Gracious gift of the Holy Spirit to the Christian heart (2 Cor. 3:2-7). //

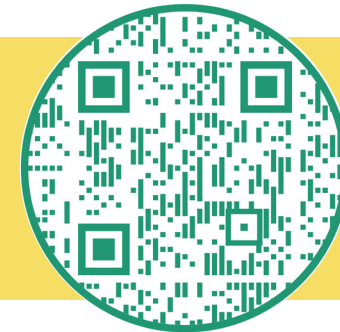
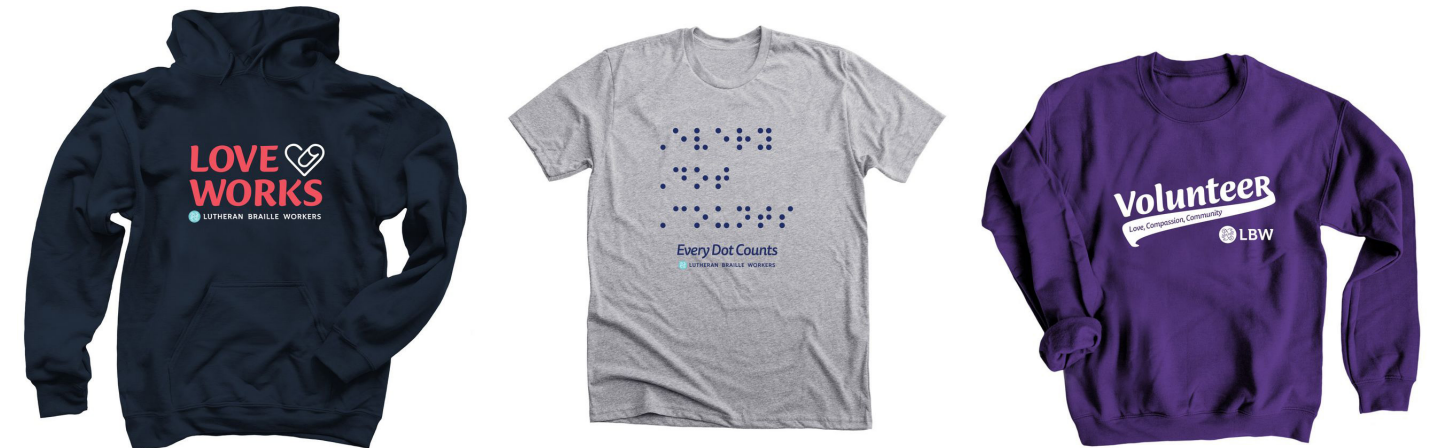
For many of us who are blind, the routes through an unfamiliar place are followed exactly at first, with every landmark touched with cane or hand, and every potential hazard skirted widely, after we've stopped moving and noted its presence. We follow the instructions of the good people walking with us as literally as we can, but once we know a place, we have the freedom to navigate with the confidence that we will not get lost, hurt ourselves, or break anything.

Our friends no longer need to be quite as hands on, because we know the route by heart, and have gotten rid of disorienting habits. Similarly, God's people needed the Law to manage them (Gal. 4:1-3), and make known their inability to save themselves (Rom. 5:20-21), until Jesus made us innocent and alive before God (Eph. 2:1-10). He remakes us for Himself (2 Cor. 5:17-21), and continually puts our sinful desires to death (Rom. 6:1-7), freeing us by the Spirit to know...

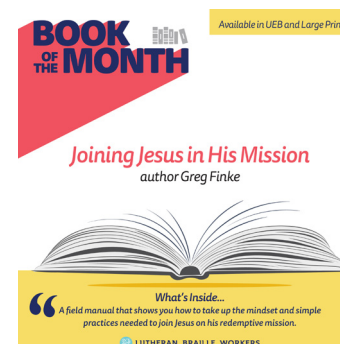
