"I grew up in west central Kansas and our family life was centered around our church consisting mostly of Germans from Russia and each summer after wheat harvest was over we would have an all day Mission Festival with Missionaries from distant places as speakers. I soaked up every word they said about bringing Christ to those in Darkness.... I used to think I would like to be a Missionary when I grow up... Then in 1982-83 MC#31 was started by Eileen Heller at my Church here in Topeka... I was still employed elsewhere at that time but always followed what the Center was doing... I retired in 1999 and in Jan of 2000 I visited the Center and started volunteering as a packer and just sort of evolved into Assistant Leader to Eileen who was retiring because of her health. About three or four years into the leadership it dawned on me 'Hey, I'm a Missionary!' WOW! I feel the Lord had that in mind for me all along and I feel so honored that he chose me to see that His Word got to the Spanish speaking countries. I realized there was really a need for Large Print Spanish for the sight impaired, which is what our Center does. We have been so blessed by how Our Lord has supplied very dedicated Volunteers and the means to carry out His work..."

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Estate Planning with SFC Estate Coaching

Starting in January, LBW will begin hosting seminars in the state of Texas promoting free estate planning services for its volunteers. The first seminar will be held at Trinity Klein Lutheran Church in Klein, Texas on January 22 at noon as part of a luncheon. The estate planning services are completely free to the individuals and are intended to help people ensure that the family members and ministries they care about will be provided for. There is no pressure, nor is there any type of sales pitch for LBW. These services will be provided by SFC Estate Coaching and are completely confidential. LBW, or other ministries, will only be notified if you give SFC Estate Coaching permission to do so. LBW only wishes to help its volunteers ensure their estate plans are in proper order.

How do we get MORE Volunteers?

First and foremost, volunteering is an incredible act of generosity people are able to perform. We know for a fact that many volunteers of LBW do so because they feel part of a wonderful ministry, feel a connection to the people receiving Bibles or outreach, and especially feel a tremendous support and fellowship with the other volunteers in a group or ministry center. Do not keep this joy to yourself. Encourage other people to also know the thrill of this connection and ministry!

Second, LBW recognizes that with many of our centers in LCMS churches, there is a potential struggle in keeping volunteers. The LCMS is an aging church and many wonderful volunteers are passing away each year and joining our Lord and Savior in heaven. But, there are hundreds and thousands of people in the world looking for ways to serve the Lord and others, but don't know how or where to go. Bring them to your center!

Third, without volunteers, thousands of our Bibles and other materials could not be created so many people would not receive the Good News of Jesus in their hands. These individuals would not be able to touch the Word of God and find hope in these pages. Therefore, it is critical we find ways to bring new volunteers into this ministry!

1. Get a round table and take a break! One of the most important ways to keep volunteers is by providing opportunities for fellowship and support. Most volunteers agree that they can rely on each other for prayer, laughter, tears, and strength in times of joy and times of difficulty. Having a round table and taking a break together is one of the easiest and most effective ways to keep volunteers engaged and coming back.

2. Ask for help within the church! When was the last time somebody from your center stood in front of each of the services at church and spoke about what is being done at the ministry center? When was the last time somebody stood in front of the church and asked people to come and volunteer when they are able to do so? For many center leaders who have been asked, it has been years, if they even remember the last time this occurred. Don't be afraid or unwilling to ask the church at least once a year. Even if only one person comes, it is still one more than before, and you never know how God will work in somebody's heart through your request.

3. Ask for volunteers at other churches and not only other LCMS churches! Ask for volunteers from all of the Christian churches in your community. Whether ELCA, or Methodist, Episcopal or Baptist, non-denominational or Catholic, assembling Bibles and serving people who are Blind or Visually Impaired is not restricted to LCMS members. LBW is one of the only organizations in the universal Christian Church, and the largest non-profit in the world, providing Bibles, Christian materials, and outreach to this underserved community. There are many people in other churches who would have a heart for this ministry, but don't know we exist and aren't aware of the opportunity for volunteer service. Reach out to other churches and invite them to participate as well!

4. Reach out to local schools, colleges, and youth organizations seeking service opportunities! Ministry Center 47 in Fort Worth, Texas has local high school Key Clubs, and college sororities provide multiple groups each week and month for Braille Bible assembly. What's even more amazing is most of these groups are not from Christian institutions, and they produce an amazing amount of quality work! Private academies, public schools, colleges, universities, Boy and Girl Scout troops, among other groups, are usually looking for service opportunities. By putting your center out there as a service location, you may provide young people a chance to serve and contribute to this ministry.

5. Ask other organizations and senior living communities! While a lot of young people and young families may not be able to serve during the week day, there are countless retired people looking for something to do, especially as more and more Baby Boomers retire. Reach out to other community service organizations, including Rotary and Optimist Clubs, as well as nursing homes, senior living communities, and senior centers. There may be an abundance of men and women looking for something to do once a month or weekly.

6. Have faith, be flexible, and don't be afraid to ask! It can be scary to put yourself out into the community but remember God is with you. Share this amazing experience and invite others to participate. Be flexible and willing to allow groups to meet at a different time with training. Most importantly, do not take away another person's right to say YES to volunteering at your center. Give people the chance to say yes and you might be pleasantly surprised at how many volunteers arrive at your next work center day.

This article is meant to provide some brainstorming ideas for finding new volunteers but is in no way intended to be a complete or comprehensive list of ideas. 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How do we Raise Money for LBW?

The feedback we hear most from ministry leaders is the opposition to raising money for the center or for LBW. The thing we would like to encourage everybody to remember is this:

“You are involved in an incredible ministry making a real difference in the lives of people who are often underserved. You are sharing the Gospel with other people in an incredible way. If you believe in this ministry, don't be afraid to ask others to support it. Remember God is with you.”

Raising financial support should not be scary. All you are doing is talking about a ministry you are passionate about and inviting other people to support the ministry through financial gifts. When you ask people for support, the worst they can say is no. But if you do not ask people for support, you are taking away their opportunity to say YES! Give people the chance to say, “YES” to supporting LBW and the fine work our volunteers are doing nationwide. This ministry is worth it!

The following are some ideas to help you identify opportunities to invite others to support this incredible ministry:

- 1. LBW Sunday-** One of the keys in raising funds is to share what your ministry center is doing with the group most likely to be receptive and supportive—your church. Talking in front of an education hour, speaking for a few minutes during announcements, getting inserts into the bulletin, having envelopes on a table, posters on the bulletin board, having a representative from LBW visit, requesting prayers, volunteers, and gifts, even once a year, is a great way to gain new supporters.
- 2. Ask your volunteers-** We often hear leaders state, “We don't want to ask the volunteers. They already give their time and we don't want to seem greedy.” Yet, a simple fact is people tend to financially support organizations which are in their heart. For most of our volunteers, LBW is one of the most important ministries outside of their church, and possibly a university or school. Again, if a person cannot support LBW financially, but continues to volunteer, we are extremely grateful and in no way disappointed. Yet, too many volunteers aren't even asked and thus don't know that they too can support LBW with their gifts or estate plans. Even if you place a stack of envelopes next to your sign-in sheet and encourage people to prayerfully consider a gift, it is wonderful what can come out of this.
